DESCRIPTION OF THE SCHOOLS

PORG is an independent, coeducational, secondary grammar school for grades six through thirteen. Founded in 1990, it was the first private school to open in the Czech Republic following the fall of communism.

All PORG schools, which are known for their high academic standards, provide a broad liberal arts and sciences education. We cultivate in our students a lifelong passion for learning and a respect for others in their pursuit of excellence. We have established a community where individuals develop competence, confidence, and character. Our active learning environment, both in and out of the classroom, fosters creative and critical thinkers who are both unafraid to express their ideas and prepared to seek meaningful lifetime success.

ACCREDITATIONS

All three PORG schools are fully accredited by the Czech Ministry of Education and are recognized as the part of the state school network. Additionally, Nový PORG and PORG Ostrava are authorized IB World Schools that deliver the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme.

ADMISSIONS

The PORG schools are highly selective. Students are admitted based on their previous academic performance, as well as their performance in state and school-specific entrance exams. Admission requirements also include an application and a transcript. Approximately one hundred new students are enrolled annually at all three secondary campuses, drawn from a pool of nearly three hundred applicants.

STUDENT BODY

The Class of 2022 has one hundred and six students with twenty five students at PORG Libeň, fifty two students at Nový PORG, and twenty two students at PORG Ostrava. The total enrollment at our three schools is eight hundred and nine students with four hundred eleven boys and three hundred ninety-eight girls in grades six through thirteen. Financial aid is awarded to approximately twenty percent of the student body.

FACULTY

PORG has a distinguished and dedicated faculty which consists of one hundred and twenty teachers at all three schools, representing ten nationalities. Over eighty-seven percent of the teachers' body hold master's or doctoral degrees.

SENIOR SCHOOL CURRICULUM

Students at **Nový PORG** and **PORG Ostrava** may elect to complete the full IB Diploma Programme and be enrolled in our most challenging course offerings. Students from these two schools who do not choose to pursue the IB Diploma may opt to obtain IB Certificates without completing all requirements of the full Diploma, and be awarded a Czech high school leaving qualification (Maturita).

Students at **PORG Libeň** follow the General Education Programme for Czech grammar schools and they are awarded a Czech high school leaving qualification (Maturita).

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GRADING POLICY

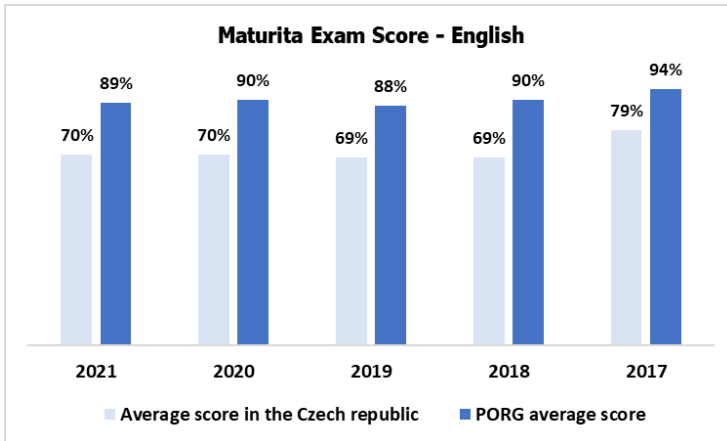
The numerical grading system at all PORG schools is designed to give a clear evaluation of each student's academic performance in the context of each school. The grading scale is from one to ten, with the exception of the IB Diploma Programme, where the scale is one to seven. Our grading standards are exceptionally high. Given our rigorous admissions process, the diversity of our course offerings, and our policy of accepting talented new students directly into our IB Diploma Programme, none of our schools rank students. Furthermore, because we use two different grading scales, we do not compute a grade point average.

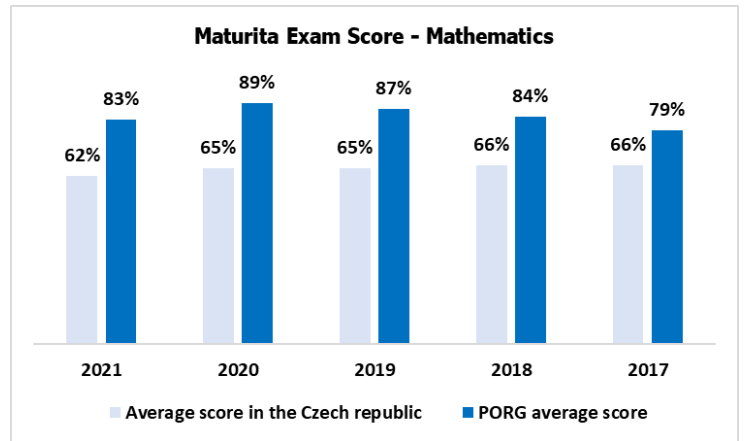
