We will continue with more reading, writing, noticing, and discussing the world around us. All the kids try very hard and show an interest in new things which makes me really happy!







YEAR 2

Year 2 is special; we are preparing for a whole new level of KS2. We are growing and learning what is expected of us.

In English, this means we are focusing more on reading comprehension and writing properly using a pen. They should be reading more fluently and be able to discuss what we have read. We will continue to focus on discussing a range of stories, poems, and information books. The sooner they can read well, the sooner they can increase their vocabulary throughout the curriculum.

In Math, we will practice counting, reading, writing, and comparing numbers to 100. We work with a range of materials and contexts in which multiplication and division relate to grouping and sharing quantities. They use multiplication tables to recall multiplication facts and practice mental calculations.



YEAR 3

Year 3 is where our Fab Four (Dominik, Lia, Minjoon, Yuha) begin their school life as Key Stage 2 students. There is a step-up in how we learn as more independence will be required in taking on more responsibility in gaining knowledge from all school subjects. We aim to follow the basis of my 3Cs for success in classroom studies to produce good results;

- CONFIDENCE we come to school with a "we can do it" attitude which means we prepare and practice in all subjects.


My goals this year are to spark an interest and curiosity about the natural world as well as develop the skills for lifelong learning.



Spanish

The Spanish curriculum starts in KS2 but we already introduce the language to the children in KS1 in the Spanish club. They start to learn vocabulary and simple language skills such as talking about who they are, their names, age, favorite color, favorite animal, parents names, and what they like to do.

For KS2 in Year 3, they start to have 2 hours of Spanish lessons a week. They start learning the basics of the grammar, for example, how to introduce themselves, greetings and intensive vocabulary (animals, colors, numbers, things they use in class, things they have in their bedrooms, activities and verbs, etc.) As the years progress, they advance in the language skills and communication.
