In Year 2, we like to use all our senses and incorporate different types of learning aids to help us. We know there are different types of learners, and we like to make sure everyone gets involved.

In Math, we learned about fractions by folding paper into halves, fourths, eighths, sixteenths, and not for the faint of heart, thirty seconds! We managed to compare different fractions and sizes and decide whether we would like 1/4th of a cake or 2/8th. Learning about tens and ones is made easier when you have cubes to stack and visualize.







In Science we were learning about Changing Materials, and how we can get a completely different substance. We incorporated this into our art lesson, using watercolors and salt. The salt absorbs the water colour and leaves a beautiful design when it has dried and scraped off.

In Social Studies we were studying about First Aid, and we learned about different accidents that could happen and how to prevent and treat them. We now have a handy booklet!

In English, we like to use our Silly Sentences cards, which have the words divided into different grammar points. It makes for some funny sentences.







Winter is coming to an end and Spring is fast approaching with great optimism in all our study classes and clubs. 








DENTAL CARE - 10 January














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
